Early Years Area

We have recently converted the Nurture Room in to a designated Early Years classroom. The children use this room for some sessions during the week. It incorporates a large role play area, finger gym, music area and a construction room to explore, learn and play. This has allowed Y1 & 2 pupils to work in a quieter environment for some lessons.













Touchscreen Boards

We have upgraded our classroom whiteboards and projector to state of the art interactive touchscreen boards. The Class 1 board is mobile so can be used in the hall, conference room and Nurture room when needed. We have also added a board to our small group room so all teaching areas are now equipped with first class technology.


